### Thursday, August 18, 2011

*Ernest Oberholtzer Island visit* – Mary Holmes of the Oberholtzer Foundation led an island tour for the HOCP. Those in attendance learned about Oberholtzer's life and toured the buildings he built on the island. *Voyageurs National Park's Ethnobotanical garden tour* – Park Ranger Lisa Maass led the HOCP group on a tour through the ethnobotanical garden being built near the park's Rainy Lake Visitor Center. Lisa explained the layout of the garden and how it will be used as a visitor destination as well as an educational site.

He presented information about the habitats moose use and their movements in these habitats as well as threats to moose populations.
